



POSITION: Clinical Services Bachelor's Level Intern  
SUPERVISOR(S): Clinical Director  
TIME FRAME: 2 + Semesters

QUALIFICATIONS:

The Bachelor level intern shall be enrolled in a 4-year university or college Social Work, Psychology, or related program. This intern shall demonstrate: competency in working with people from different cultural and socioeconomic backgrounds; ability to work independently and as a part of team; and ability to communicate effectively with colleagues and clients. Experience working with youth and families is preferred.

Must be available for 40 hours of Crisis Intervention training at beginning of internship. This training is held largely on the weekend. An interview is required before approval for placement.

OVERVIEW OF POSITION:

This position is responsible to assist in the provision of crisis intervention and life skills training to runaway and homeless youth. Specific duties will be agreed upon by the intern and agency supervisor, based on the intern's skills, experience, area of study, and interest.

DESCRIPTION OF GENERAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The following are general responsibilities of the position after demonstrated competency and sufficient preparation:

- Complete one weekly 4-hour shift on the agency's crisis line, providing telephone crisis intervention and referral services to youth, families, and others in need
- Complete follow-up calls to youth and their families who have exited services within the past 12 months
- Provide independent living skills training for homeless youth
- Complete client skills assessments with homeless youth
- Complete ongoing documentation
- Attend meetings with supervisor
- Complete other duties, as assigned by supervisor
